June Church Mission Project – Safe Harbor



Offering plates are out each Sunday

During the month of June, Concordia's mission emphasis will be the Christian work of Safe Harbor of North Carolina. Located in Hickory, this ministry is designed to help women experiencing homelessness rebuild, renew, and recover, anchoring their lives in Christ. Safe Harbor's one-year recovery program focuses on holistic healing in an intentional Christ-centered community to prepare women for successful independent living. Classes emphasizing honesty, accountability, good stewardship, healthy nutrition, and exercise are taught. Safe, low-cost furnished apartments are provided

along with meals and job training.

The vision statement of Safe Harbor is "to inspire everyone we encounter to a thriving and purposeful life in Christ." That is the work of the Church! You will have the opportunity during the month to contribute to this vital Christian recovery work. Offering plates designated for "Safe Harbor" will be positioned in the narthex and transept each Sunday. Thank you for giving to the Lord.

Mission Trip to Belize

Our missionaries, Pastor Jason and Emily Groth, along with their four children, have invited us to visit their ministry field in Belize and serve with them for one week. Leaving on Monday, August 17th, and returning on Monday, August 24th, we will spend 5 days working at Camp Concordia, cleaning, repairing, painting, and improving the grounds. Camp Concordia was purchased for the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod in 2020. It is located 50 miles west of Belize City and plans to be a ministry hub for national church events and international short-term teams.

On our final full day in Belize, we will attend church at Christ Lutheran Church in Seine Bight, followed by a single-day vacation Bible school program that our group planned and will lead for community children. Our prayer is that this children's Bible program will introduce many families to Pastor Groth and the Lutheran Church.

Needed are 6-8 believers willing to smile and share Jesus' love and encouragement in Belize. Passports are required. The 3 ½-hour flight from Charlotte to Belize City currently costs around \$700 per person and will be deferred based on need. Please contact Kevin or Teresa Graudin (828-578-4682) to express your interest in this trip. **We need a team in place by June 15th.**

Concordia Sponsoring a Second Missionary

We have been asked by the LCMS Mission board to sponsor a second missionary, this one from the Southeastern District! The Rev. Jonathan Anderson, a 2025 graduate of Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, is serving as a missionary in Panama. Jonathan is from Greer, SC. His home congregation is Immanuel Lutheran Church in Simpsonville, SC. Before preparing for the ministry, Jonathan worked in the construction industry. Since he is a native South Carolinian, Jonathan will be able to visit Concordia often on missionary furloughs.

The Mission and Ministry team will ask the church council to support this ministry through the endowment fund, specifically designated for missions.

Your Family A Foster Care Family



Currently, in Catawba County, there are over 200 children in foster care. While families work towards reunification, these children need foster homes where a caring family helps them through difficult times and demonstrates empathy and compassion. Is your home a place that could fit one more plate on the dinner table? Could you commit time and understanding to a child and represent them in court? Maybe you have resources to commit to support families experiencing foster care such as providing clothing or beds, or a meal for a busy family.

Family Builders of Catawba Valley is the Social Services department responsible for placing children in foster, adoptive, or kinship homes. They hold information meetings on the second Tuesday of every month at 6:00 PM in their Family Service Center. These meetings provide more information about getting licensed as a foster, adoptive, or kinship family and discuss what foster care involves.

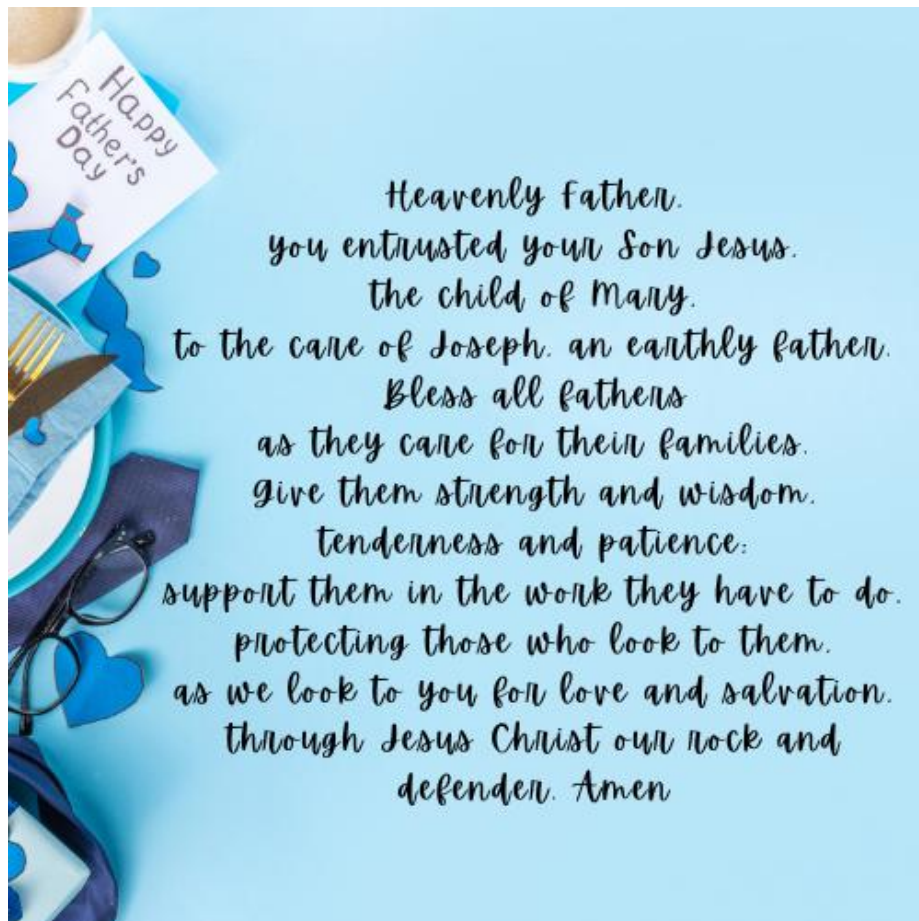
Whether you have been to Camp Linn Haven before or this would be your first time, Teen Servant Week is a great opportunity to live out your faith and be part of something bigger than yourself.

We are thrilled to announce that the 29 graduates of UCHS Class of 2026 collectively earned over \$3.2 million in scholarships! True to the UCHS tenet of servant leadership, the Class of 2026 contributed over 5,500 hours of service to the community.

Catawba County Honors Student-Athletes Sledge & Garmon

Seniors Madison Sledge & Patrick Garmon were honored as 2026 Scholar Athletes of Excellence at the Catawba County Sports Hall of Fame.

Madison Sledge & Sam Parker Sign Letters of Intent

Madison Sledge signed her national letter of intent to compete in Division I in cross country and track at Wofford College. She is planning to major in Biology, with the intent to pursue veterinary school. Madison is one of UCHS's most decorated student-athletes. She has placed second, third, and fifth place in State Cross Country meets; she won first place this year for the 1600 at the state indoor track meet, she has been awarded Co-Athlete of the Year for Catawba County for track, and she broke a 25-year record in Catawba County for a female mile time. Madison currently holds the fastest female times in Catawba County for both the 1600 and 800.

Sam Parker signed his national letter of intent to compete in Division 1 golf at LaSalle University. He plans to pursue a degree in business. He has been an integral member and leader of the UCHS golf team over his four years of high school and also plays individual golf tournaments year-round. Sam has served as team captain both his junior and senior years of high school. He has received all-conference honors all four years of high school and received all-state honors his junior year. Sam was the individual runner-up for the NCISAA state championship in golf last year, and he helped lead the UCHS team to compete in the state championship both his sophomore and junior years.

The Stewart's Seminary Journey

(Psalm 107:1) We give thanks to God for his goodness and mercy and for you, those who have walked with us in different stages of life, that helped lead and encourage me to take this seminary journey, and to see how God has been preparing and walking with me and our family these many years. This seminary phase of our journey is not over, but we are excited for the next phase, Vicarage, year three out of four. Vicarage is similar to an internship, a year where I and other Vicars will be given an opportunity to continue to learn and grow in a congregational setting as we serve alongside a supervising pastor. We are excited to share that I will be serving as a Vicar at Immanuel



Lutheran Church in Olivette, MO. This church is in the St. Louis metro area and approximately 15 minutes from the Seminary. We are thankful that God enabled the Seminary to find us a fitting place for me to serve and learn here locally as it provides further continuity and less upheaval for our daughters. It was a lot for us to take this journey and to uproot our girls from essentially the only life they had known in NC with friends and family. This local vicarage allows for them to stay connected to the new friends, school, and area that they have grown close to these last two years. The ability to stay local also gives us the opportunity to connect and grow close to other members of the body of Christ at our church home for the next year. We cannot wait to see what God has in store for us at Immanuel and as we continue here in the St. Louis region.

As the semester winds down and the girls' school year is only a few weeks from wrapping up, we anticipate the things that lie ahead. The girls continue to encounter new and wonderful experiences through school and extra-curricular activities. Aileen recently completed her acting debut as she participated in her school's operetta that is led primarily by the fourth grade class. The performance was an adaptation of *The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* and she excelled in playing the 'white witch' for two scenes, performing a dance at one point, and singing throughout the entirety of the production along with her classmates. If you would like to watch Aileen, search for CCLS TV Live on YouTube, it is titled the 2026 Operetta under the 'Live' Option. Esther also got to participate as a mouse and she loved being a part of the production to support her big sister and the older schoolmates in fourth grade. It was a terrific program and we were again reminded of the blessing we have received for our kids to be able to learn and grow in a Christ filled Lutheran school environment.



Esther continues to display her love of dance as she twirls and spins through the house, the aisles of stores and just about anywhere we will let her. She loves to teach her little sister dance moves and perform homemade dance routines with her sister, Lydia. This passion for dance was rewarded as she was invited to be a part of a special dance class at her dance studio and she couldn't be more excited, especially because it is alongside one of her best friends.

Lydia also continues to dance and amaze us with her mimicking of her older sisters. She still loves supporting and encouraging her older sisters, but sometimes does just want them to realize how big she is and let her take the lead. She still loves school, just not nap/rest time. We keep reminding her that one day that she will not have that and that there are many days ahead where she will wish she had a nap/rest time (things our parents said to us and we didn't believe and now things we say to our kids and they do not believe).

Jessica and I are excited to not only know where we will be next year, but also for the next two years as our seminary journey continues. We will miss our seminary friends as many of them are being sent all across the country with even one going to our old stomping grounds in NC, but we know that great things are in store for each of them and their families as they connect with the body of Christ. We cannot wait to see how God uses and helps my classmates and their families to grow as we all continue to be formed for pastoral ministry. We hope to make another trek back to NC prior to the start of my vicarage year. The exact dates are still being worked out, but it will most likely be the beginning of July. Prior to that, with encouragement from Jessica, I signed up for a two week class in Germany with two professors and other students from Concordia Seminary. We will study sermons of Martin Luther and see where he preached many of them as we travel to several different cities in Germany. This is a wonderful opportunity, but also one that requires me to miss the last week of the girl's school year and will be the longest time I have been away. We ask for your prayers for Jessica and the girls while I am away, along with safety for me and my group as we travel. I am looking forward to returning from that trip with a greater appreciation for our Lutheran church, but even more so a deeper appreciation for the art of preaching and proclaiming the word of God to his people. After that trip I look forward to

spending much time with the girls and preparing for my vicarage. Jessica will continue to work, but is looking forward to her much needed break as she takes some time this summer to be with me and the girls.

Thank you all for your continued support, encouragement, and most importantly your prayers.
