

OVER & UNDER

The expression, “over & under,” can mean different things to different people. To the avid upland game bird hunter, the over and under may be the kind of shotgun he uses. Instead of a double-barrel side by side, many hunters use an over and under shotgun. For those who’s interest is in gambling over and under means something completely different. An over and under bet is one that bets on the combined scores of the two teams. One can bet that the total score will be either over or under the anticipated total.

Another application of this idea of over and under comes into play in the church. I was told many years ago that in pastoral ministry one needs to be prepared to be **underwhelmed** by the people’s response and **overwhelmed** by the grace of God. For example, I have been here at Concordia for 6 years. During that time I estimate that 80-90 percent of the people have never once been to Bible Study led by their pastor. That is an **underwhelming** fact. I have no reservation about writing this because 80-90 percent of the people here don’t read these articles. At the same time I am constantly **overwhelmed** by the grace of God who gives me the desire and passion for teaching His Word to old and young alike.

While being underwhelmed is part of life in general, for I am sure disappointments abound in every aspect of life, we who are the children of God stand **overwhelmed** by the grace of God. Our failures and shortcomings and all our sins are taken from us by the One who loved us to the point of death, death on the cross. Disappointments fade when we see ourselves as the deeply loved and forgiven children of God. Let us truly live in grateful response to God's overwhelming grace.

As a kid, I remember my Grandma and Grandpa Diepholz' home with extraordinary joy. Family fun. Great food. A legacy of faith. One of my lasting memories of that house was the table that sat between their twin beds. It contained a lamp, a Bible, a catechism and a hymnal. These were well-worn, as Grandpa read to Grandma every night before they went to sleep! What a treasure these tools of faith are! Let us spend some time this month in the hymnal to help us better understand our life as Christian stewards! To do this, we will use *LSB 785* "We Praise You, O God."

*We Praise You, O God, our Redeemer, Creator;
In grateful devotion our tributes we bring.
We lay it before You, and kneel and adore You;
We bless Your holy name, glad praises we sing.*

Stewardship is an act of worship. It flows from the grace and mercy we have received in Jesus! Faithful stewardship can never start with us. Our sinful nature will make us and our desires the center of our worship. Our tributes, our giving and our serving only flow from how the Lord Jesus has given of Himself for our sake! When we have this in clear view, our knees bow and our praises flow freely! All this flows from the Name that has been placed on us in Holy Baptism!

*We worship You, God of our Fathers, we bless You;
Through trial and tempest our guide You have been.
When perils o'ertake us, You will not forsake us,
And with Your help, O Lord, our struggles we win.*

Our stewardship that flows from what God has done for us in Jesus Christ is rooted in history. Passed from one generation to the next, stewards of the Gospel connect God's provision in the past to His continued care in the present.

So often, the struggles we face are self-inflicted. While there are indeed perils that can shake us from outside of

ourselves, we are more likely enduring the suffering that comes because of our own choices that are outside the Word and will of God! But even in these situations, the Lord who loves us will never forsake us. When we become selfish, self-serving and self-destructive, the Lord NEVER abandons! The Lord helps us to overcome the struggles in faith and win the victory the steward rejoices in!

*With voices united our praises we offer
And gladly our songs of thanksgiving we raise.
With You, Lord, beside us, Your strong arm will guide us.
To You, our great redeemer, forever be praise!*

Stewardship is more than just an individual thing. There is a corporate nature to our steward life. We see this in the Divine Service. There, stewards of all ages, all economic strata and all languages are joined in the singular task of praise. This stewardship of praise flows from the altar to us, out into the world and then back to the altar! God's strong arm leads us in this stewardship 24/7. This makes stewardship, in all times and places, a matter of worship. We praise our Redeemer who has entrusted us with this great stewardship of the Gospel which forgives our sins, grants us new life and salvation. And this treasure we freely share for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor!

TIME FOR A LITTLE R&R

Instead of the traditional Rest and Relaxation, the R&R for the upcoming season of Lent is Reflections on Repentance. The theme is borrowed from a Lenten Series produced by Northwestern Publishing and is based on Psalm 51. The theme is borrowed but the midweek services and the messages will originate from Concordia Lutheran Church. In this first of his 95 Theses, Martin Luther wrote, "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, 'Repent,' he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." Psalm 51 is a masterful example of Biblical repentance. Until that time when either our Lord returns or we are taken to His nearer presence every believer needs to hear and heed the call to repent! Please prayerfully consider the opportunity the Lord sets before you to come and worship during Lent beginning on Wednesdays at either 11:30a or 6:30p and continuing throughout the Holy Season of repentance.

Many Christians give something up during Lent as a reminder that Jesus gave up everything when He came down to earth to die and rise for us. Lent is a time where we remember our sin, repent and focus on Christ's suffering for us. In this time of reflection and repentance, instead of (or in addition to) giving something up, it can also be helpful to add something into our lives. These verses from 1 Thessalonians tell us to “pray without ceasing” and to “give thanks in all circumstances.” One habit that could be helpful to focus on is prayer. As a family, you can start developing this habit by finding times to pray together such as before meals, before bed or whenever works best in your family’s routine.



From the Board of Mission and Ministry

March Church and School Mission Project

This month, Concordia Christian Day School and Concordia congregation will focus our attention of the pro-life, Christian ministry of the **Pregnancy Care Center of Catawba Valley (PCC)**. Abortion is our nation's number one cause of death and over 30,000 abortions occur yearly in North Carolina. The Pregnancy Care Center demonstrates the love of Christ by meeting pregnant women and their families where they are and empowering, encouraging and equipping them on their journey. All services are provided with open arms at no cost to the client.

Their new facility (pictured and located on the corner of Highway 127 and 2nd Avenue SE) will provide new state-of-the-arts medical labs, ultrasound and medical rooms that will enlarge PCC's ability to service our community. An offering to further this work will be taken on Sunday, March 29th.

The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) is explicitly and strongly pro-life, advocating for the sanctity of human life from conception to natural death. Abortion is not a moral option for the Christian. Through its Life Ministry, the church actively opposes abortion—viewing it as contrary to God's Word—and supports legislative, educational, and mercy efforts to protect the unborn, elderly, and vulnerable.



News from Our Missionary Family

Pastor Jason and Emily Groth and their children Gideon (14), Esther (11), Martha (9) and Joanna (6) are thriving in their new home in Seine Bight, Belize. It is a beautiful part of the world and in the winter months, the temperature is very mild and comfortable. They are working at Camp Concordia in Belmopan, meeting with young people and families in hopes that opportunities to teach the catechism to high school students will materialize. They also are involved in the Belize Mission Society's feeding program ministering to the very young and vulnerable.

They ask for prayers for their children who are being homeschooled. They also ask that God will give them continued wisdom, patience and faithfulness in serving the people of Belize. Ask the Lord to bless the work at Camp Concordia, to order their time and responsibilities well and to sustain them in body, mind and spirit as they labor in God's harvest field.
