HOW YA DOIN'?

How ya doin'? O how we love to use these three little words. Although we would all admit it is not exactly the best conversation starter. How do we answer when someone asks, "How ya doin'?" We usually say, "I'm good." Conversation over. Moving on. In the one-on-one scenario, the three-word question and two-word answer is generally sufficient. Because we generally don't want to get into a long, drawn-out conversation on how someone is really doing. In the broader picture of the Church, however, it is necessary to ask the question more deeply. So, Concordia Lutheran Church and School, how ya doin'? With these three words, the conversation is just beginning. Most people are aware of the changes that are happening in our church and school. 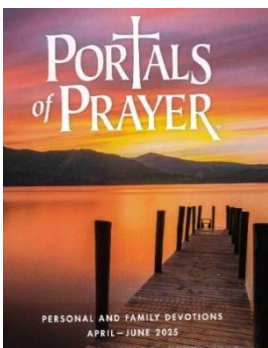

News from the GROTH family in Belize



At the end of February, Pastor Jason Groth was advised to return to the USA to have gall Bladder Surgery. He was away from his family for the entire month of March. While he was away, the FORO (a group of individuals, congregations, and organizations that support and partner with the mission) gathered in Orange Walk Town. They plan, pray, and encourage one another in their work. They share stories of challenges, surprises, and quiet evidences of grace at an evening meal. They are not a crowd of strangers. They are the church.

Here is a list of prayer requests from Pastor Groth:

PLEASE PRAY FOR:

- Healing and Dependence on God: Give thanks that the Lord provides care for His servants even in unexpected illness, and that His mercies are not interrupted by hospital stays or disrupted plans. Pray that those who serve in Belize would hold their health and strength loosely. trusting the God who tends to frail and finite creatures. and that any season of weakness would deepen rather than diminish their faith and calling
- The Church Taking Root in Belize: Give thanks for the congregations in Orange Walk and for Pastor Roldan Rios, the first Lutheran pastor to be raised up from Belize itself. Pray that the Lord would continue to

build His church through faithful preaching and the administration of the Sacraments, that these young congregations would be strengthened in the Word, and that the harvest field in Belize would yield fruit that endures.

- Families Serving Together: Give thanks for families who bear the ordinary costs of missionary life, separation, uncertainty, and the slow work of building a home in a foreign land. Pray that the Lord would sustain and knit together the households of those serving in Belize, that children would grow up knowing why they are here, and that families would be a witness in themselves to the faithfulness of God across generations.

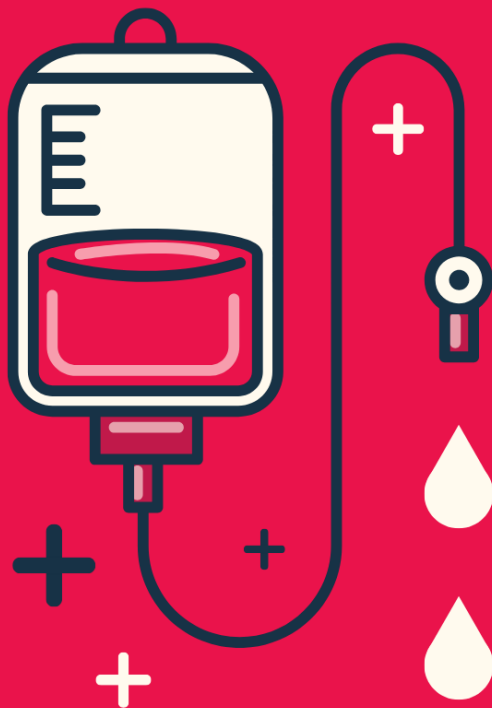
